

Betws GG and Melin y Wig Community Council– meeting over TEAMS on 12/1/21 at 7.30p,

Present: Councillor Eryl Williams, Hefin Lloyd-Davies, Shaun Turner, Emyr Roberts, Nia Williams, Geraint Jones.

Apologies: Gwyn Edwards. Elliw Roberts tried but could not be present due to technical difficulties.

Everybody were welcomed to the meeting by the Chairman, Hefin Lloyd-Davies. Wishes were sent to Ieuan Davies who is very poorly in hospital.

Minutes- minutes from last meeting (September 2020) were agreed correct. No meeting held during November due to Covid. Nobody declared any interest in any of the items on the meeting's agenda.

Financial matters were discussed :

- Payment £23.99 to Fasthost (Internet Page) - betwsgwerfylgoch.cymru (renewed for 12 months)
- Payment £40 – Information Commissioner - Data Protection renewal.

Councillors agreed to support application for signage at Clawddnewydd – slow down because of horses.

Online training sessions were discussed– Nia Williams would like to attend training on dealing with planning applications. No training available by Unllais but Clerk will notify her if any training opportunities arises.

Planning Application Clegir Ganol. No objections were noted..

Precept 2021-2022 – last year precept was raised by £2 (2020-21 tax base 166) £3233 annually. Councillors this time to keep the precept rate unchanged, Tax Base reduced in 2021-22 from 166 to 160 – why? Clerk to make enquiries.

Chair spending payment allocation for 2021-22. £50 was agreed.

Poor condition of roads – Clerk notifies the County of all potholes she sees. Clerk asked all Councillors to notify her of any potholes they see (Clerk needs to know exact location and Councillors to send her a photo if possible). Main road between Ruthin and Clawddnewydd in poor condition. Councillor Eryl Williams said that the road from Pool Park to Llanfwrog will be resurfaced soon.

Councillors were notified (for information) that Gordon Hughes, Chairman of Corwen Community Council has been elected to represent on the Conwy and Denbighshire Public Services Board,
